A NOTE FROM PASTOR KRISTIN

"Where did your imagination stop? And where might the Spirit be nudging you?" Whether we were dwelling in scripture or in one another's stories during our Awaken Dane meetings, these were the questions we were always asked to contemplate. What was it about the story that got our attention, and maybe caused us to make connections with other things in our minds and hearts? And why is that particular part where our imagination stopped? How might the Spirit be nudging us in that noticing?

Those are great questions for us all to be asking – not just of scripture, but of all the stories we hear, the moments we experience. They help us to be more aware of what is happening in the moment, but also help us to make those important connections with God's presence in all of it and to sense what the Holy Spirit is stirring in us.

For the past nine months, I have been privileged to be a part of our All Saints Awaken Dane team. We have practiced dwelling in the Word, deep listening, and are just starting the process of some experiments to reach out to our neighbors.

This past week, we gathered for our last Awaken Dane meeting for this first year in the program. We'll take a break from meetings over the summer, but will continue to work on finding ways to connect with our neighbors and with what God is doing in our part of the world so that we can be a part of it! As the church, we are often most focused on what we can do FOR our neighbors, but through this process, we are encouraged to focus on simply being WITH our neighbors, coming alongside them, listening to them, and simply getting to know them. Some of the ideas that we are working on focus on our closest neighbors - including spending time with the residents at Sylvan Crossings, hosting a dessert bar in our neighboring apartment buildings, hosting a campfire/s'mores evening in our parking lot, and having an outdoor worship & picnic in the park!

We would love to have more All Saints folks on our team! Would you like to join us on this journey? Monthly meetings with the whole Awaken Dane community will resume in September on the 2nd Thursday of every month. This summer, our All Saints team will be working on some of the experiments listed above. Whether you'd like to join the team, or simply help with some of these events, we welcome your participation! SOUTH-CENTRAL SYNOD ASSEMBLY OF WISCONSIN 2023



The South-Central Synod of Wisconsin's annual assembly was held May 20 at Evangelical Lutheran Church in Mount Horeb under the theme of "Building, Rebuilding." Attendees from All Saints were: Pastor Kristin, Jennifer Barakat and Roger Damrow. Reflections from Jennifer: It was a beautiful day to hit the road early with Pastor Kristin and Roger Damrow and drive to the Evangelical Lutheran Church (ELC) in Mt. Horeb to attend the 2023 South-Central Synod

of WI Synod Assembly. ELC volunteers are always gracious hosts for facilitating large synod events (think LEAD), and this event was no exception. It was a wonderful opportunity to connect with 300+ people from around our synod in the setting of streaming sunshine, uplifting music, and gifted speakers. Please review this recap of the day listed below and provided by the synod, and feel free to reach

out to Pastor Kristin, Roger or myself if you have any questions.

Highlights of the day include: Peter B.H. Tan, the Executive VP and Chief Design Officer for Strang, Inc. Peter spoke to the Assembly about built environments and creating a sense of place. He described the process of co-creating spaces that become places where the community feels welcomed to gather and stay. He also invited assembly goers to think about conversational places they love to gather in and what draws people to linger. Our worship leaders were Sharon Irving and Quincy Cochran. Sharon and Quincy led the assembly through song, spoken word, and a Spirit-filled presence that added life and energy to our time together, including a stunning Thanksgiving for Baptism and a moving medley of tried and true worship hymns.





ALL SAINTS CAPITAL CAMPAIGN UPDATE

Thank you for attending the information sessions, reviewing the information we provided, asking questions, providing feedback, and completing the surveys about the capital campaign proposal. Your responses were the focus of the Council's discussions and decision making.

The survey responses and comments were compiled, and the Council reviewed the results with the James Company, which conducted the survey. Overall, 44 percent of our households responded to the survey. According to the James Company, this is a healthy response (the norm is 20-25 percent).

Of those who responded, 60 percent said they would support a capital campaign to help pay our \$737,000 mortgage and sustain our ongoing operating costs. Nine respondents were uncertain and five said they would not support a campaign.



The Church Council met on May 21, reviewed and discussed the survey results at length, and agreed unanimously to proceed with the capital campaign. The Council has decided to use the James Company to help run our campaign. We made this decision because of our very limited ability to staff the campaign internally, the Company's expertise and experience with All Saints, and their willingness to reduce their fees and extend our payment schedule.

Our Church Council continues to explore all options to assure our long-term financial stability, including selling some or all of our property. Of course, our overriding goal in achieving financial stability is to enable All Saints to stay true to our mission to know, follow, and share Jesus.

We will be in touch with more updates, including the next steps in the capital campaign. Please continue to pray for All Saints and our leadership as we discern God's path for All Saints. As always, thank you again for your support and generosity.




PUB THEOLOGY ON A BREAK - RESUMES IN SEPTEMBER

Beginning in Spring 2021, All Saints Lutheran Church has been a drop-off site for Small Family Farm CSA (Community Supported Agriculture). We will continue this practice in 2023 with drop-offs beginning Wednesday, June 7. Small Family Farm supplies 300 members access to produce while preserving a sustainable farm ecosystem. Drop-offs will continue through November. Summer shares are still available as well as eggs

shares, coffee shares and flower shares. Final pickup time is 6:30 p.m. each Wednesday.

FIRST QUARTER COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Church finances again were center of attention this past quarter. We hired the James Company to help survey our members to determine if they would support a Capital Appeal, with the survey due May 7. We met with a group to discuss the potential sale of our garden space. They polled developers in the area to see if there would be interest in that space. It turned out that piece of property is really too small for developers to consider. If we need to sell, we may need to consider selling the church as is or to a developer perhaps with a potential to have space for the church incorporated into the design. Memorial funds were reviewed and money that was not designated for a specific purpose was transferred to the general fund as was some designated money that the givers agreed to the transfer. We continue to look for ways of increasing our income.

The bookkeeping of our 2022 finances was audited by two church members who are not involved with the daily finances and the books were found to be in order.

Holy Week and Easter services were very meaningful celebrations with many coming together. Attendance for Palm Sunday was 72 and 100 for our Easter service.

Deanna Simonson organized our 2nd annual rummage sale which netted the church about \$3000. Thanks to everyone who donated items and/or volunteered to help with the sale. Leftover clothes are being sent to Liberia by an organization in Madison. Leftover books were donated to the Friends of the Fitchburg Library for their bag sale. Other items were donated to a resale organization. The event was sponsored through a Thrivent Action Team which covered all costs.

2da Iglesia Pentecostal Jehova Rafa, the Hispanic church who rented from us since December has moved to their new building the end of April, so we no longer have rental income.

Church council meetings are now held on the third Sunday of the month at 11:00 a.m.

General fund offerings for April were \$23,176 (111%) versus a budget of \$20,833. Year to date general fund offerings are \$76,143 (91%) versus a budget of \$83,332.

Total Church income for all funds in 2023 was \$88,782.

Expenditures: April expenditures were slightly over budget for the month at \$27,160 versus a budgeted amount of \$26,393. Year to date expenses are over budget at \$121,289 versus a budgeted amount of \$105,641. Items of note over budget year-to-date:


