## Called to Know Jesus...(Worship Info)

### Sunday Worship, March 17, 2024 - 9:30 a.m.

This Sunday is the Fifth Sunday in Lent. "God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow all the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. We join together in worship, sharing in word, song, and meal, and leave strengthened to share God's love with all the world." (sundaysandseasons.com). The scriptures that shape our worship on Sunday are: Jeremiah 31:31-34, Psalm 51:1-12, Hebrews 5:5-10 and John 12:20-33.

We share in the meal of Holy Communion each Sunday evening. If you are gathered in person, you will receive a piece of bread and an individual cup of wine or grape juice. If you are worshipping from home, you will want to have bread or crackers and wine or juice available in order to participate in the meal.

Large print bulletins are available on the welcome desk. Please take advantage of this resource during worship and return the binder to the welcome desk following worship. We hope by making this information available in another format that we are able to better serve those that struggle to read projection.

The opening litany borrows from Isaiah 43:19 "I will make a way in the wilderness and rivers in the desert." The stories for each week all find a thread of God making a way where no way seems to be, whether because it feels hopeless or because the person God chose tries to run away or because we feel we have nothing to offer. We are given many glimpses throughout scripture of God making a way out of what seems to be no way at all, of God creating a future for and with God's people, when truly all seemed lost. Through scripture, song, and meditation, we will be reminded of the many ways God moved the faithful out of spaces of uncertainty and despair and into spaces of joy and abundance. Join us as we seek to hear and be inspired by the ways God has acted in the past, and have our eyes opened to the ways God in Christ Jesus acts in the here and now.

## spiritual encouragement for those in jail

Will you donate during Lent to the Madison Area Jail Ministry (MAJM) so that men and women in jail can experience God's grace, love, and hope?

Around 2000 years ago, a man named Jesus stood up amid a congregation and proclaimed that his ministry was to "to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners" (Luke 4:18). Even while suffering on the cross, Jesus demonstrated love and concern to a fellow prisoner, and as a result, that condemned criminal experienced Christ's love in such a way that it changed his eternal destiny. Unfortunately, despite Christ's example to minister to prisoners, too many prefer to pass by on the other side of the street, as did the religious leaders in the parable of the Good Samaritan.

Let us not be among those that pass by those in jail bur rather financially support the Dane County Jail Chaplain whose presence brings God to the women and men there. Wednesday evening Lenten offerings are spilt between the ASLC General Fund and the MAJM.
