# A NOTE FROM PASTOR KRISTIN

- Jesus is Son of God, my Savior. He is my hope that a better world will exist and prayers will be answered.
- Jesus is a constant rock of support and love; always there for anyone who needs him
- Our Savior and our light in an evermore challenging life on earth.
- Who is Jesus to me? Leader, example, kind, role model, teacher, story teller, fully God, fully human, miracle, selfless, my hope

All of these are beautiful ways to describe who Jesus is. Through your words, you preached to me that day! Each of us relate to Jesus in different ways at different times in our lives. And as grateful as I am for all of those meaningful descriptions, I am equally thankful for the person who bravely responded with more questions than answers, as they wrote, "Jesus is:

- Someone I fear.

# AWAKE AND ALERT... A NOTE FROM JOHN FRANCIS

On my way into work recently, I prayed I may be alert and open to what God had in store for me that day. To be present to nature's beauty, to the needs of those I meet, to be present to what God is calling me to be.

I like looking for hawks and sandhill cranes on my way from Waunakee to the west beltline - but that 'awareness' needs to carry me beyond those few minutes of the day. When reading my Richard Rohr devotion that morning, his focus was on - yes - 'being awake and alert'.

In Mark 13:33–35, Jesus tells his disciples, "Be awake. Be alert.... You do not know when the Lord of the house is coming, whether in the evening, or at midnight, or at cock crow, or in the morning." Christ is always coming; God is always present. It's we who are not! Jesus tells us to always be ready, to be awake, to be fully conscious and expectant. It's the key to all spirituality, because we usually are not.

#### AWAKEN DANE UPDATE

As we enter our second year of the Awaken Dane process, we are in the portion of this experience that has us actively doing experiments. No, we aren't mixing chemicals. And no safety glasses are needed (at least not yet!). These "experiments" are simply different ways to be present in our community and to engage with our neighbors. Would you be interested in being a part of this? We'd love to have you join our team! We meet once a month on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of the month with congregations from around Dane County who are also a part of Awaken Dane – and dinner is included! #### SECOND QUARTER COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Church finances continue to dominate our meetings. Council moved forward with engaging The James Company (who reduced their fees for us) to assist with the capital campaign as we felt unqualified to proceed on our own. Council engaged a company to complete and prepare for filing tax forms needed to request a \$28,000 tax refund based on an Employee Retention Credit offered by the government. This was done but it could be 8 months or more before we see anything. Oak Bank agreed to allow us to start making interest only payments on our mortgage as of June until December. Our insurance policies were replaced utilizing another company, which will save us about \$2000 annually. Our office copier/printer was replaced with a comparable machine that will save us about \$30 monthly. Council and staff are making strides in finding ways to save the church money even if it is a small amount at a time.

The group we have been in contact to discuss the possible sale of some or all of our property suggested we move forward to learn about actual interest in our property. Council agreed this is probably a good move to save time in case we need to sell our property, but it must be clear in the agreement that we are not making a commitment to sell our property and we cannot sell without congregation approval. This group receives no compensation from us unless we sell the property. We are not making any decisions about our property at this time, we are just learning our options to be prepared.

We are looking forward to the congregation gathering and inviting our neighbors to the McKee Farms Park shelter on September 17 for an outdoor worship and picnic. We received a Thrivent Action Team Grant to help with expenses so the meal will be provided for our picnic and fellowship.

We were very fortunate that a mission partner has donated a trip to Napa Valley California for us to auction off to assist the church. It was decided to request other donations to make this a fun evening event. Leigh Luedtke has agreed to coordinate and organize the auction on October 7th.

General fund offerings for July were \$31,014 (149%) versus a budget of \$20,833. Year to date general fund offerings are \$156,460 (107%) versus a budget of \$145,831. Although offerings were better for the year, they are still short of expenses.

Total Church income for all funds in 2023 was \$172,488.

**Expenditures**: July expenditures were under budget for the month at \$24,138 versus a budgeted amount of \$26,393. Year to date expenses are over budget at \$199,606 versus a budgeted amount of \$184,872. Items of note over budget year-to-date:

Snow removal: \$8,583

Gas & Electric: \$2,092 (\$2,000 for tax preparation for ERC tax credit of approx. \$28,883)

Capital Appeal: \$4,750


**Balance Sheet Comments:** As of July 31, 2023, the checking account balance was \$27,437 and the savings account balance was \$15,632. The mortgage payable balance is \$734,974.


