A NOTE FROM PASTOR KRISTIN

Advent just might be my favorite season of the church year. The four weeks leading up to Christmas and the celebration of Christ's birth are full of anticipation, joy, and hope. The hope that we experience during Advent is a hope that we know will come to fruition. We wait and hope for something that has already happened – Jesus coming among us as God made flesh. But we also wait for Jesus to come again in glory – something that we continue to wait for, but that we hope and trust will happen – someday.



Our recent capital appeal – "Hope Everlasting" – has had us talking about hope a lot around here lately. And while we did not reach our lofty goal for the Mortgage Fund por-

tion of the appeal, your generous responses filled me with hope. While we are still a little uncertain about what the future holds for us, we move forward with hope in the One who continues to remain faithful to us!

And it is not just in our faith promises that I see hope. I experience hope when I hear joy bubbling up from the sanctuary as music groups rehearse on Wednesdays – and even more hope fills my soul as they offer their gifts to add to our worship. Hope is evident as people gather on a Sunday morning to write cards that carry hope and joy to those incarcerated at the Dane County Jail. And hope abounds as I gather with our confirmation students and they are able to share their highs and lows, as well as where they are seeing God in their daily lives.

Hope is powerful. But as John Kirvan writes in *God Hunger*, "Our hope, it seems, always carries with it a hint of doubt. We want something to happen, but maybe it won't." He goes on to reference Evelyn Underhill, an English poet and novelist who became a popular spiritual writer later in her life.

Kirvan writes, "There's no such wavering for Evelyn Underhill when she talks not just of the future but of every passing moment. 'I expect,' she says, 'the resurrection.' And she means from every death, however little, however frequent. We have every right to expect the same thing and no need to undermine our hope with 'maybes,' no need to limit our expectations to possibilities. There is no final death because 'beyond every death is life.' Beyond every death is resurrection. This is not one hope among many but the very heart, the very being of hope itself and therefore our lives in and with God."

As we move forward through this season of Advent and into a new year, we do so with hope. Hope that is grounded in the promise that God is always providing new life. And that hope can be free of doubt, as we have seen over and over that we have a God who is always with us, giving hope, sustaining hope, and building on hope. Whether we see that in big ways or small moments, may we all make room for the hope that God is making all things new – including you and me!

A NOTE FROM OUR COUNCIL PRESIDENT, BOB LAVIGNA

As I write this during Thanksgiving week, I think about how I have much to be thankful for, including being a member of the All Saints community.

All of us on the Church Council are thankful for your response to our Hope Everlasting Appeal. As reported in last week's update, the campaign generated about \$176,000 in annual faith pledges and almost \$220,000 for our mortgage reduction. We know that each of you carefully and prayerfully considered pledging and some had to dig deep to help. Thank you.

It's never too late, so if you'd still like to contribute, please return your response form to the church office, or bring it to Sunday worship. If you need an appeal packet, you can call the church office (608-276-7729).



Despite your positive response to the appeal, we continue to face severe financial challenges, and the Council continues to discuss and consider options to ensure or financial future. Among our challenges is the need to refinance mortgage starting in January 2024, and we are applying to several sources for a new mortgage. We will discuss our finances in more detail at the January 14 annual budget meeting, and the January 21 annual meeting. With your continued support and prayers, we will successfully meet these challenges.

Also apropos of our finances, we are seeking a Council Treasurer to replace Michelle Slawny, whose three-year term ends at the end of 2023. If it were up to me, I'd ask Michelle to be Treasurer for Life but our Constitution won't allow that (and pretty sure Michelle wouldn't either). It is no surprise that Michelle has graciously offered to be a resource for the next Treasurer, who can either be elected by our congregation in January or appointed by the Council (therefore having a voice, but not a vote at Council meetings). While financial experience could be helpful, Michelle assures us this is not necessary. The commitment is 5-6 hours a month. If you are interested, please reach out to Pastor Kristin (pastor@allsaints-madison.org, 608-276-7729). We're grateful to Michelle for her commitment and outstanding service as Treasurer.

I know that I tend to focus on the financial aspects of being stewards of All Saints, but I also know that there is far more to All Saints than our finances. We are community of faith, brought together by our belief in God and commitment to "Know, Follow, and Share Jesus." Despite our financial challenges, I know it is essential to keep that front of mind. Money is a tool for us to achieve our mission, not an end in itself.

And this Thanksgiving I feel especially blessed and grateful. Whenever the Powerball jackpot rises to some unfathomable amount, I'm tempted to buy tickets, even though I know rationally that the larger the pool is, the longer the odds of winning. I then remind myself that I've already won the lottery – living in America, having a wonderful family and good friends, being healthy, and being a member of the All Saints community.

(But I still buy Powerball tickets - sigh.)

Thank you for who you are and what you do, and have a wonderful and blessed Thanksgiving.

QUALIFIED CHARITABLE DISTRIBUTION OPTION

Are you required to take distributions from your IRA account? Are you over age 70 ½? Would you like to save on your income taxes? If you answered yes to one of the first two questions, and to the third, completing a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA account may be a good idea for you!

A QCD is an otherwise taxable distribution from an IRA that is paid directly from the IRA to a qualified charity. These distributions help satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and are free from both Federal and State income tax. You can think about them as "above-the-line" deductions since they reduce your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) as well as your Taxable Income. Reducing your AGI might help keep you from being subject to additional Medicare Part B premiums too!

Your IRA account provider will be able to direct payments from your IRA account to charity of your choice.

Something else to consider...donate the amount you'd normally have paid in income tax to the charity too! For example, if you complete a \$5,000 QCD to your charity, you're likely saving 25-30% (\$1,250-\$1,500) in Federal and State income taxes, so give that to your charity too!

SCAM ALERT!

We have been made aware of another email scam requesting recipients purchase gift cards for Pastor Kristin. They start out with a message saying that Pastor Kristin needs your help with an urgent matter or has something she needs to discuss with you right away. If you respond to those emails, they will eventually ask you to purchase gift cards for someone in need. These emails are NOT from Pastor Kristin. Pastor Kristin will NEVER text or email members with this type of request. It is safest



to check the email address (not just name) that the message is coming from. Pastor Kristin will only ever contact you using her allsaints-madison.org email address or her new gmail address

(pastorkirstinwoelk@gmail.com). Please report any unknown emails to your email provider (gmail, hotmail, etc.).





HOPE EVERLASTING APPEAL

All Saints has been blessed by the faithfulness and generosity of our members, past and present. We are now wrapping up our Hope Everlasting Appeal. This appeal made two requests. First, we asked you to consider renewing and increasing, if possible, you're annual faith promise. Secondly, we asked for an additional three-year pledge to our mort-



gage fund. Re-establishing this mortgage fund is especially important, as we work with our lender to renew our mortgage in December 2023.

Thank you to all that have responded to our appeal. We set a lofty goal of raising \$350 thousand for our 3-year mortgage reduction appeal. While we did not achieve that goal, we have received \$219,000 in pledges toward our 3-year mortgage appeal and \$176,000 in faith promises for the upcoming year. This is quite an accomplishment and will help us to reach financial stability.

If you have not yet sent in your pledge, it is not too late. There are additional appeal packets in the Narthex and the office at church. Thank you for sharing your blessings with All Saints. We are grateful for your generosity.

Messages were also written during another Fellowship Hour or by members at home for a total of almost 80 cards with personalized messages. Thank you!

Contributions:

General fund offerings for September were \$24,854 (119%) versus a budget of \$20,833. Year to date general fund offerings are \$202,187 (108%) versus a budget of \$187,497. Although offerings are better than expected for the year, they are still short of our expenses. As you can see below, expenses exceed offerings by \$30,977 so far this year. Total Church income for all funds in 2023 is \$218,355

Expenditures:

September expenditures were under budget for the month at \$25,022 versus a budgeted amount of \$26,393. Year to date expenses are over budget at \$249,352 versus a budgeted amount of \$237,693. Items of note over budget year-to-date:

- Snow Removal: \$8.583 (\$2.583 over budget)
- Misc. Office & Admin Exp: \$2,122 (\$2,000 of this was the fee to have the tax forms prepared for the ERC tax credit. All Saints should receive \$28,883 in credits.)
- Capital Appeal: \$11,250

Balance Sheet Comments:

As of September 30, 2023, the checking account balance was \$40,468 and the savings account balance was \$15,641. The mortgage payable balance is \$734,974. Oak Bank has agreed to reduce our mortgage payment to interest only for the rest of 2023.

THIRD QUARTER COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

We have yet to hear from the IRS about the Employee Retention Credit tax refund for which we filed. Oak Bank will look at where our finances stand at the time our mortgage expires in December to determine if they will renew the mortgage. We will proceed with other mortgage applications after we have the Capital Appeal contribution figures to help solidify our finances. We have moved the majority of our savings to checking as currently the interest rate is higher in our checking account. Another small church was asking about renting space from us, but they have decided to go elsewhere.

There are a couple of developers very interested in our property. There is a potential for them to offer a ball park figure of \$2 million for our property, but it would not be feasible for them to configure space for our church into their projects. That amount is good to hear, however, we are not yet ready to sell. The ability to renew or get a new mortgage may be that decision maker.

2024 budget discussions have started. A budget hearing should occur 1/14/24 and the annual meeting on 1/21/24.

We are looking for folks to fill necessary church positions. We need someone to serve on the personnel committee now. In January, we need a new treasurer, who could choose whether or not to serve on council. We also have two council positions vacant in January.

Additional items are missing from the church. Police were called, but not much can be done as the building was not broken into. It was decided the building needs to be rekeyed. Staff are working on a plan to determine who should have access to what areas before they can move forward to have new keys made.

The storage/garden garage has been re-shingled with donated shingles and the good work of Jerry Sieling, Sean Hemstad, Mike Barakat, and Elijah G. (a recent visitor to our church).

The outdoor worship and picnic at McKee Farms Park September 17th and the All Saints Auction on October 7th were fun gatherings and huge successes. Thank you to all who helped and attended.


